Message from the Chair

Do you wear a watch?

Why would the chair of the Avon Education Foundation ask such a question?

Because it says a lot about how fast the world is changing. If you Google "who wears a watch?" you will find a lot of articles about watches as status symbols. You will also find a few suggesting that watches are going the way of typewriters, buggy whips and dinosaurs.

Today's students listen to music on their MP3 players while texting each other on their cell phones with Facebook™ open on their laptop computers. Perhaps these seem like expensive and frivolous diversions from playing outside, talking and hanging out with each other and, certainly, from reading textbooks and literature to become educated. However, all three gadgets may hold e-book software from Kindle™ or nook™ and downloads of such free classics as Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's *The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes*. And all three definitely show the current time.

The Foundation was founded with the mission "to promote and enhance excellence in education...by providing funding and other resources for public programs which encourage, recognize and facilitate educational providers and students who initiate innovative and creative learning projects." The AEF is proud to be able to support projects like this year's Hudson Family Grant awarded to Avon High School to update the district's video editing software (see page 2) which will enable our schools to strengthen 21st century learning.

Twenty-first century skills will be required by today's students to succeed in the world, and acquiring these skills benefits older learners, too. It goes without saying that core skills--the basics of Reading, wRiting and aRithmetic--will still be essential. But so will such skills as the ability to access the internet, use a digital camera, and appreciate and leverage diversity. The increasingly complex and rapidly changing world requires life long learners who can think creatively and use sound reasoning to solve problems. "Interactive communication," teamwork and collaboration require understanding the etiquette of each environment in which communication happens as well as increased personal responsibility for making a contribution. Finally, success requires not only planning, priority setting and managing results but also the flexibility to respond to contingencies and choosing the right tools--intellectual and technological--to accomplish the desired outcome.

When I consider the role the AEF can play in helping Avon's learners acquire 21st century skills, I believe we have spent over \$160,000 of our contributors' generous donations well. We have funded projects to complete the purchase of e-books for the high school library and "Fitness for Life" in 2007 that are, on the surface, purely technology acquisitions but which enable students to successfully apply technology to gaining knowledge and maintaining physical fitness. At the other end of the spectrum, we have funded initiatives such as helping the Town-wide Choral Festival get going and, coming in March 2011, a Choir and Orchestra Collaborative Performance that may appear to be simply arts projects but which also

FROM THE GRANT COMMITTEE

The AEF awarded 5 new grants this year. In March, the AEF "prize patrol" surprised four 2009-2010 grant recipients with awards totaling nearly \$22,000. In September, an additional grant of \$3,015 was awarded to the Avon Public School (APS) Music Department.

Avon High School received an \$11,200 grant named for the **Hudson Family** to extend the scope and range of the Carl D. Perkins grant approved by the State Department of Education. The district has updated its video editing software with funds from the AEF. The Perkins grant, \$22,323, is intended to develop, expand and improve technology education. AHS faculty, with the technology education teacher from AMS, will determine what is required to create a concentration in video production skills from the foundation skills covered across a number of existing courses: Computer Modeling and Visualization I, Broadcast Journalism, Media Ethics and Video Art courses. Suzanne Drapeau, art teacher, is directing the project with Robert Vojtek, now AHS assistant principal.

The AEF also awarded \$6,664 to the **Avon High School Library Media Center**, under the direction of Julia Cowans-Wilhelm. This award, partially funded by the **UNICO Grant**, will complete the purchase of the Gale Cengage EBook collection. A 2009 AEF mini grant got the program started. The on-line reference collection contains nearly 300 volumes, with a print value of more than \$92,000, and is accessible to all AHS students at school or at home.

Pine Grove School 4th grade teachers Jon Moss and Chris Grgach were awarded the **Duffy Family Grant** for \$2,500 for the new ADA-compliant playground under construction. The grant supports purchase of academic components for the playground.

Avon Middle School received a mini grant of \$1,500 towards new tennis courts for the school. One goal of the project is to reinstate regular physical education curriculum in racquet sports at AMS and after-school programs that were discontinued when the courts were closed several years ago due to poor surface conditions. In addition, new courts will enable extending tennis to the high school's Unified Sports Program which pairs students with disabilities with non-disabled peers to participate in competitive team play. Principal Marco Famiglietti accepted the grant along with community representatives Laura Young and Wendy Howard. Raising additional funds is the focus of a community effort.

Tom Kawiecki, AMS choral music teacher, and the **APS Music Department** have recently been awarded a grant to underwrite the start up costs for a choir and orchestral collaborative performance. The concert of mixed repertoire, including John Rutter's *Mass of the Children*, will be held on March 30, 2011 at Welte Auditorium (at CCSU). This event will include all AHS choir students, select members of the orchestra and wind ensemble, and the AMS Arioso Choir. Tickets will be available to the public for priority and general admission.

In 2009, Mr. Grgach and Mr. Moss were awarded a grant to pilot the use of graphic novels. "After using the graphic novels for a full school year, we have seen a notable improvement in the interest and focus of many students in small reading groups. The graphic novels capture students' attention and help them to make meaningful connections to the storyline and its characters. We are eager to continue using them this year and are grateful to the AEF for funding this successful program!"

provide students with unique life experiences and new ways of interacting with each other and expose all to musical diversity.

Earlier this year we met with acting superintendent Jody Goeler, Board of Education chair Peggy Roell, and school administrators to discuss what more the AEF might do to help Avon achieve its long range strategic educational goals. Education foundations have helped their towns accomplish some wonderful things by coupling BOE strategy with community commitment to excellence in education. For example, the Glastonbury Education Foundation is funding construction of a greenhouse at the Gideon Welles Elementary School, and the Cheshire Education Foundation provided funds to establish a dedicated science center at the Chapman School. The Easton Learning Foundation has raised over \$115,000 in support of its town's STEM (Science Technology Engineering Math) objectives. As the administration continues to develop its strategic plan we asked them to keep in mind that we are willing to help.

Please help us continue creating opportunities for innovation in public education here in Avon. Volunteering is a great way to get to know more about us and use the skills you have to advance public education in Avon.
